

B: GENERAL PERMIT CONDITIONS

The following permit conditions apply to all Stanislaus County Restricted Materials Permits except those specifically conditioned otherwise

1. Seasonal restricted materials permits are issued to growers or their authorized representatives who have been certified to use restricted materials. Pest control dealers and agricultural pest control businesses must have a copy of the permit in their possession prior to sale, delivery, or application of restricted materials.
2. **No applications of Restricted Use pesticides for agricultural use shall be made within ¼ mile of a school in session or during school sponsored activities when children are present.**
3. A notice of intent (NOI) shall be **submitted a minimum of 24 hours prior** to the use of listed restricted materials. NOIs may be submitted by FAX, electronically, or in person at the Agricultural Commissioner's office. NOI's for all fumigants, Penncap and Furadan shall be submitted a minimum of **48 hrs** prior to application along with a detailed map showing exact distances to sensitive sites. If an application is proposed for Sunday or Monday, the NOI must be submitted no later than 12:00 noon the Friday prior. (See specific regulations for methyl bromide field fumigations.)
4. If the intended application does not take place within 4 days of the proposed application date submitted on an NOI, the permittee must resubmit another NOI to the Agricultural Commissioner for the new proposed application date. The NOI should be marked "RESUBMITTAL".
5. Approval must be granted by the Agricultural Commissioner for a waiver of the notice of intent requirement. (This will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.)
6. Pesticide use reports must be submitted for all the applications made by the grower or grower's employee by the 10th day of the month following the month in which the work was performed. All agricultural pest control businesses shall report the pesticide applications within 7 days of completion.
7. Emergency exemption (Section 18) permits expire at the same time as the current Section 18 registration expires. If the Section 18 pesticide is subsequently re-registered, the permittee must appear in person to renew the Section 18 permit. The Section 18 label is a part of the registered label and must be present at the application site at time of use.
