
The Stanislaus County Agricultural Crop Report for 1994 is hereby submitted in compliance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The Stanislaus County gross agricultural income for 1994 is \$1,121,853,000. This is a decrease of approximately \$16 million or 1.4% from 1993. The Fruit and Nut Crop Category lost \$58 million, with Walnuts, Almonds, Peaches and Cherries leading the decline. Also showing losses are Seed Crops and Apiary Products. All other categories advanced. Individual commodities posting gains include: Dry Beans, Broccoli, Melons, Sweet Potatoes, Tomatoes, Chickens, Turkeys and Milk. Cattle and Calves lost significantly, as did Chicken Eggs and Turkey Hatching Eggs.

It must be noted that these are gross figures and do not indicate net profit. Also, figures shown do not reflect on any individual operation since the whole county is the smallest unit measured for any particular commodity.

We wish to express our appreciation to the many persons who contributed to the preparation of this document. Special thanks go to Sheryl Emery, who compiled the report.
