J: 1,3-Dichloropropene

Changes in regulations to 1,3-Dichloropropene went into effect on January 1, 2024. Stanislaus County has implemented the conditional requirements, outlined in **TABLE 1**, to properly evaluate proposed uses of 1,3-Dichloropropene in accordance with Volume 3 of the California Department of Pesticide Regulation (CDPR)'s Pesticide Use Enforcement Program Standards Compendium, Appendix J.
