B: GENERAL PERMIT CONDITIONS

The following permit conditions apply to all Stanislaus County Restricted Materials Permits except those specifically conditioned otherwise.

- 1. Seasonal restricted materials permits are issued to growers or their authorized representatives who have been certified to use restricted materials. Pest control dealers and agricultural pest control businesses must have a copy of the permit in their possession prior to sale, delivery, or application of restricted materials.
- 2. Pesticide application restrictions of Restricted Materials for production agricultural use will apply to Private Schools, K-12, Monday through Friday, during the hours of 6:00 am 6:00 pm, refer to Title 3. California Code of Regulations, Section 6691 for restrictions on distance, application equipment, and the type of pesticide applied.
- 3. A notice of intent (NOI) shall be **submitted a minimum of 24 hours prior** to the use of listed restricted materials. NOI's shall be submitted 24 hours in advance for use of Aluminum Phosphide products for rodent control. NOI's may be submitted by FAX, electronically, or in person at the Agricultural Commissioner's office. Field fumigant NOI's shall be **96 hours** in advance. For example: if the field fumigation is proposed for Monday, the NOI must be submitted no later than 12:00 noon the Thursday prior (See specific regulations for methyl bromide field fumigations). The applicator must notify the County Agricultural Commissioner (CAC), if the fumigant application date on the NOI is changed.
- 4. If the intended application does not take place within 4 days of the proposed application date submitted on an NOI, the permittee must resubmit another NOI to the Agricultural Commissioner for the new proposed application date. The NOI should be marked "RESUBMITTAL".
- 5. Approval must be granted by the Agricultural Commissioner which may allow less than 24 hours' notice if he determines that because of the nature of the commodity or pest problem effective pest control cannot be attained or when 24 hours are not necessary to adequately evaluate the intended application. (This will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.)
- 6. Pesticide use reports must be submitted for all the applications made by the grower or grower's employee by the 10th day of the month following the month in which the work was performed. All agricultural pest control businesses shall report the pesticide applications made within 7 days of completion.
- 7. Before use of fumigants containing the active ingredients of metam sodium or metam potassium, the property operator or the property operator's designated agent must complete a Department of Pesticide Regulation approved metam potassium/metam sodium stewardship certification training within the previous 12 months of the date of application and hold a valid certified applicators license or certificate.
- 8. Emergency exemption (Section 18) permits expire at the same time as the current Section 18 registration expires. If the Section 18 pesticide is subsequently re-registered, the permittee must appear in person to renew the Section 18 permit. The Section 18 label is a part of the registered label and must be present at the application site at time of use.
